

Future Training

Police officers, firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, doctors, nurses, and others in emergency response roles are regularly tasked with responding to emergencies and disaster sites and communicating with various people who have been involved in or witnessed an incident.

Emergency preparedness and response professionals need to know how to respond to an emergency and how to meet the needs of everyone who may be affected.

However, some <u>research</u> has shown that there is "a gap in first responders' ability to meet the functional and access needs of some people with disabilities." To address this gap and be able to respond effectively and with respect, it is critical to understand the different types of needs and how various impairments can affect individuals with disabilities and access and functional needs (DAFN).



The **Campus CERT** concept was created to address preparedness and response capabilities of college and university campuses, which often function as "a city within a city" and have their own emergency management capabilities. The program organizes volunteers into teams and provides training to help ensure that volunteers can aid in a more effective, safe, and responsible manner (see FEMA's Campus CERT Starter Guide). Campus CERT volunteers can also support the nonemergency needs of the institution of higher education, such as managing traffic and crowds at large events. Campus CERT programs may also be able to support CERT activities within the local community.



The **CERT and EMA teams in Lake County** had supported the tragic events associated with the active shooter event in Highland Park on July 4th. The IL COAD set up a Family Assistance Center (FAC) in conjunction with the Red Cross, FBI, and Lake County Emergency Management Agency on July 6.

The FAC had asked for additional "Ambassadors" to help the public needing assistance navigate through the different partner agencies that were onsite. Agencies included the Salvation Army and Red Cross but also included the Crime Victims Compensation, States Attorney Office, discussions with FBI for item retrieval, and onsite counseling.

Good evening,

I wanted to take this opportunity to provide a follow up to the cardiac arrest that occurred at the recent Long Grove festival, and acknowledge how much CERT makes a difference in our communities. During the strawberry festival 6/26 in Long Grove, a 52-year-old male collapsed and was found in cardiac arrest. Prior to the short response and arrival time by LGFD, there were several medics there with their families who stopped and helped this man. Off duty LGFD Paramedic Billy Eisner immediately responded, along with Paramedic Tim Strok from Inverness and Wheeling Paramedic Nick Brehmer, who all began working on this patient. It is my understanding that the CERT team responded immediately, with lifesaving equipment. Soon after LGFD responded and worked the patient, they achieved ROSC (return of spontaneous circulation). The patient was transported to NCH who currently is stable, alert, appropriate. He is out of the ICU, stable and doing well at this time. Kudos to the CERT Team, ever ready and always present at community events. Their quick actions made a difference in the outcome for this patient. Indeed, it does seem to take a village as everyone works together to save someone's life. What an extraordinary group of individuals, off duty medics enjoying a festival with their family, the CERT team, who are a constant at these events, EMS and Hospital staff, all coming together to positively impact the life of someone who was also out enjoying the festival before his collapse.

Once again, the reason this patient is doing well and able to be with his family, is from the immediate responses by off duty medics just enjoying their day, the CERT team being present and having lifesaving equipment immediately available, along with the excellent actions and interventions by the LGFD and the exceptional care by the ED & Hospital Multi-Disciplinary Teams. Great job by all, it certainly does take a village. Not sure if there was anyone else on who was involved directly in this patient's care. If so, please pass along our gratitude and appreciation for all they did so that this patient can also enjoy this week-end with his family.

What did strike me besides the very good outcome thus far, is something that John Jaworski, BC and EMS Coordinator at LGFD said, "that he also liked that Billy's son could see his Dad be a hero". I suspect the other family members and loved ones who saw their Dads or Moms jump into action and be that hero, it must be an extraordinary feeling for them. **YOU** are all heroes to the patient's loved ones, especially when those patients are able to come home again. Thank you all. Well done.
